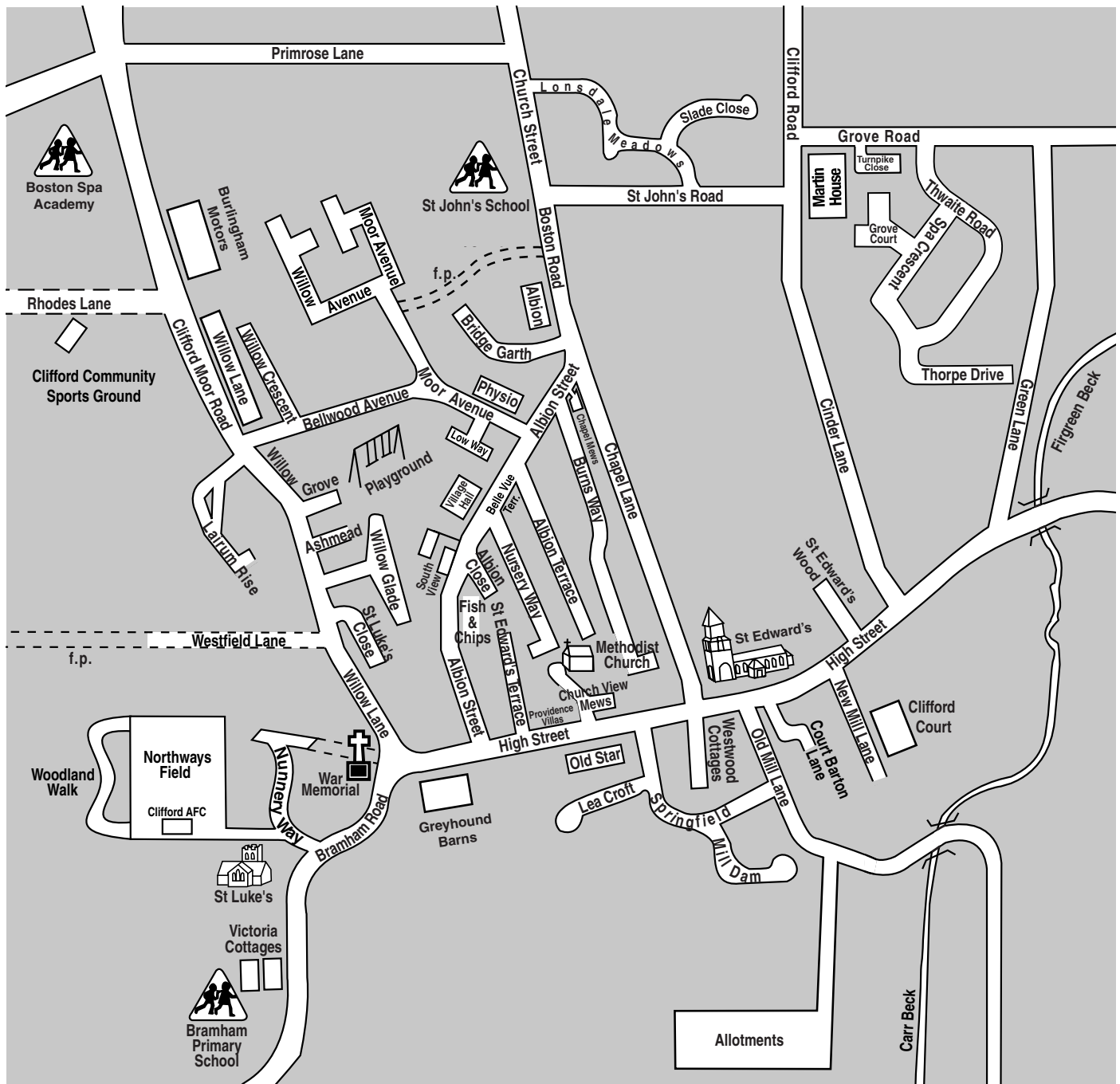

Clifford Advent Calendar Window Trail

Following the success of last year's trail, we are looking for more households to get involved this year.

For anyone that missed the trail last year, the idea is that a window lights up consecutively each evening from 1st to 24th of December in homes around the village until, on Christmas Eve, we have at least 24 beautiful windows (the more the merrier) in the village for the community to enjoy. Last year this was a truly lovely event to be involved with, and a great way to get into the Christmas spirit, that lots of people in the community enjoyed too.

Everyone is welcome to take part whether you are uber-creative or just want something fun to do. If you'd like some inspiration from other communities, please have a look at the We are Clifford Facebook page.

Entry is free. Please register to participate in the event by 10th November 2021 if you meet the following criteria:

- Private Houses or businesses must have a window that faces onto a well-lit street with a pavement/footpath.
- The windows will need to be lit from the date you are assigned in December until 31st December 2020 between 4:30 and 9:30 pm.

The Windows

The theme for the window decorations is anything seasonal – general wintery (including local landmarks), religious, seasonal non-religious (e.g. Father Christmas, TV etc).

Windows need to be lit so that the decorations can be seen from outside during darkness. Also bear in mind the protection of your privacy in your design.

The event logistics

A new window will be lit every day from the 1st until 24th December and will remain lit until the 31st December 2021. All windows will be lit between the hours of 16.30 and 21.30. If there are more than 24 private entries, then two or more houses will be allocated a date. If you would prefer to start on a specific date, please inform us when you register, and we will do our best to accommodate this. We try and plan the route so that it's a nice walk around the village with a different starting point each year.

August Recess update

Mobile Speed Indication Device

The mobile Speed Indication Device (SID) has been in operation in both Clifford and Bramham since the beginning of August. The SID is being rotated between the two villages every 3 weeks. As well as acting as a deterrent against speeding, data from the device will be used to inform decisions about future traffic management strategies. Data from the device will be published on the Parish Council website as well as a summary of the Traffic Management Meeting on 28 September 2021.

Volunteers are needed to help operate the SID. Please contact clerk@cliffordparishcouncil.gov.uk if you can help and if there are any locations in Clifford where you think the SID should be used.

Brown Bins

There have been ongoing problems with Leeds City Council failing to empty residents' garden waste bins (brown bins). The Parish Council has raised this issue with LCC Waste Management Department and LCC Ward Councillors. LCC have advised that they are struggling to get enough crews to empty bins due to staff shortages. The collection of household waste and recycling is prioritised over garden waste collection. LCC advise that if your brown bin has not been emptied on the usual day you should leave it out for 2 days as the refuse crew may return during this time.

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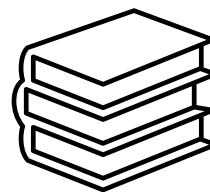

CLIFFORD WALKERS AUGUST 19th 2021

Buckden Triangle Walk – Upper Wharfedale – 8 miles approx.

It was a perfect day for our walk, which started steeply for the first half mile along a stony track, an old Roman road, from the National Dales car park in Buckden. As the track levelled out, we stopped for a well-deserved drink and to admire the wonderful views. Some of us did also stop and stare with fond memories at the path up to Buckden Pike! We continued and opted for a path that gently descended to the picturesque hamlet of Cray and avoided a shorter steep descent with stepping stones over Cray Gill. Our walk continued around the back of the White Lion pub in Cray following a high-level traverse contouring the hillside above the woods. Our lunch stop shortly before Scar House afforded magnificent views over the classic U-shaped valley below with its lush valley bottom meadows, wooded valley sides and exposed moorland tops.

At Scar House all 10 walkers chose the longer route to Yockenthwaite (meaning “Eoghan’s clearing in a wood”) picking our way through limestone outcrops to eventually join the Dales Way and back along the pretty riverside path to Hubberholme and Buckden. Yockenthwaite is near to the source of the River Wharfe (“winding river”) and the first 15-mile section of Wharfedale is named Langstrothdale. We identified minck in the river and the birdwatchers in the group spotted a grey wagtail and a dipper.

We made a quick visit to the mainly 12th century St. Michael and All Angels Church in Hubberholme, famous for its rood loft, pews made by the Mouseman Robert Thompson and the unmarked remains of J.B. Priestley in the graveyard. We walked the last mile at a reasonable pace to arrive at the village shop just before its legendary prompt closing time of 4p.m. We enjoyed our refreshments sitting on the village green where we met up with 2 other members of our group who had ambled at their own pace along the riverside to Hubberholme and beyond. An enjoyable day out!

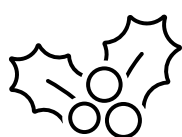
FAQ - When should I get my copy of OUTLOOK?

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Linton Antique Society's 2021-21 season

Following its successful 2020-21 online season, the Linton Antique Society is planning to return to Linton Memorial Hall beginning on 14 October for the start of a monthly programme of live events interspersed in the darker winter months with a couple of online presentations. Meetings at the Hall will continue as long as it is safe to do so but, if conditions change, the speakers will switch to online presentations to ensure the show goes on.

Topics include the fascinating story of the Accrington man who became right-hand man to the famous art nouveau designer Louis Tiffany, the centuries-old Silk Road trade route between China and Europe, the story of Leeds mass-tailoring firm, Burtons, and the history of garden follies. Auctioneer Adam Partridge talks about his busy life split between television appearances and running his auction firm, and we will gain rare insights into the skills of a top antiques restorer.

OUT AND ABOUT IN CLIFFORD

The Old Star pub

Early in September the boulders at the entrance to the car park were at last taken away to be replaced by yellow locked barrier posts. There had been a buzz in the air for some weeks over July and August that the Old Star pub was to re-open in October. Now we know for certain it is going to open up some time just after you have read this.

When you have chatted with the new publican who is busy tidying up the place after just over two years of closure, the situation becomes clearer. The precise date of re-opening is not yet decided but is likely sometime during the first two weeks of the month. All depends on how long the re-decorating etc. takes.

War Memorial

It was interesting to find a bouquet of greenery lying at the foot of the cross of the war memorial bearing the message: "*Lest we forget from the Creaby Wedding Clifford 20-8-21*"

Is there perhaps a family connection between one party of the marriage and a name on the memorial? Whatever, how touching to find two people, enjoying one of the most exciting days of their lives, thinking of those who lost their lives so long ago.

Not spotted earlier, there has also been a wreath lying at the base of the memorial marking its Centenary. It is not clear who put it there, but thanks are surely due to whoever it was. Covid restrictions made it impossible for the village to have its planned event to mark the occasion in May, so this was a welcome compensation.

Cornelian cherries

Near to the memorial is the ever-growing Cornelian Cherry tree (proper name – *Cornus mas*). It displays small yellow flowers in profusion during spring and these become small red fruits by the autumn. Lots of them fall off and decorate the ground underneath. The berries are edible but, it has to be said, not particularly palatable as they are rather astringent. They can be used to make jams etc. if you want to try. *Cornus mas* is most usually seen as a bush but ours was bought as a sapling and trained to become the shape of a tree. However, there are lots of stems growing from down below as it is trying to revert to its normal habit.

Wall pointing

Opposite the war memorial some wall pointing has been carried out. Clifford's heritage includes a number of walls built when it was an agricultural village community. Lots of them are made of a particular limestone (once known as magnesian limestone but now called dolostone). The technician doing the work explained that these walls have to be treated with traditional lime mortar. Use of modern cement can result in damage to the stone itself. It's good to see that time and money is being spent to conserve our village. After all, much of the older part of the village is a Conservation Area!

Road signs covered by greenery

At the corner of St. John's Road leading into Boston Road there is a road sign telling traffic to GIVE WAY. At present, it can't be read because it is obscured by hedge growth – perhaps the highways authority can be persuaded to undertake some maintenance?
