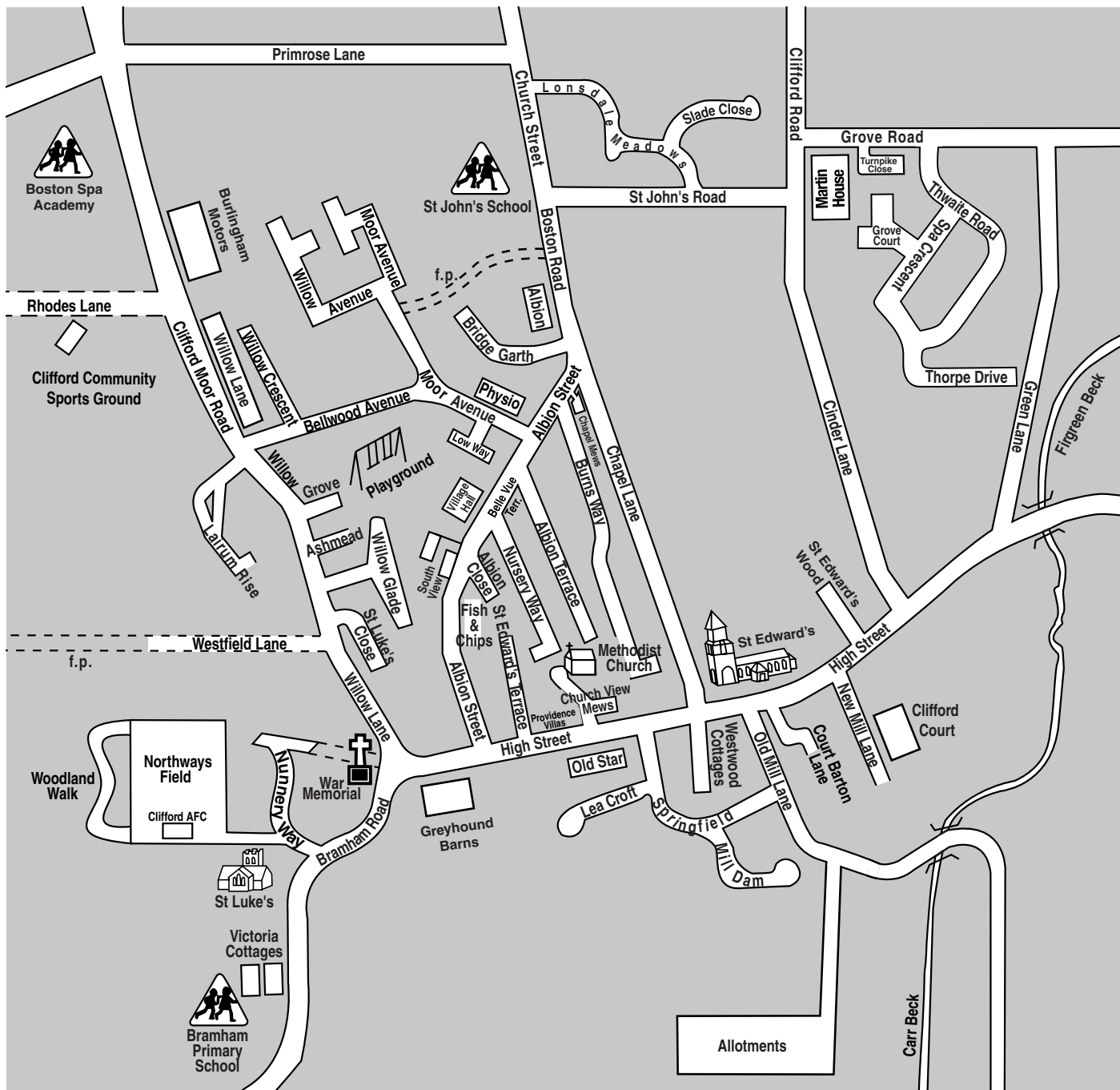

From the Parish Council Meeting on 28 July 2021

Traffic Management

Many residents are increasingly concerned about speeding traffic in Clifford and inconsiderate parking. In particular, the risk to children and parents walking to and from Bramham Primary School.

The Parish Council has arranged a public meeting to discuss traffic management in Clifford. The meeting will take place at **7pm on Tuesday 28th September 2021** at Clifford Village Hall. The meeting is open to all residents. LCC Ward Councillors, representatives from the Bramham Parish Council Traffic Management Working Group and LCC Highways have been invited.

The aim of the meeting is to understand the concerns of all residents and to discuss the options to manage traffic within Clifford. Longer term, as part of the review of the Neighbourhood Plan, the Council is considering developing a Traffic Management Plan for Clifford.

The mobile Speed Indication Device has arrived, and initial training sessions have been arranged. The device will be used in a range of location throughout Clifford and Bramham. Please email clerk@cliffordparishcouncil.gov.uk if there are any locations where you think the SID should be used.

Northways

Thank you to residents who helped clear rubbish from Northways playing field following the eviction of a group of Travellers who have been camped there from the 27 to 30 July. Traveller encampments on public land have been a problem in Wetherby and the surrounding parishes over the summer. The Parish Council will be working with Leeds City Council and West Yorkshire Police to try and manage this issue.

Legacy to the Council

The Parish Council has received a generous legacy from the estate of the late Richard Alan Dunnington. Under the terms of the will the council can use the interest from the Trust Fund in perpetuity. The capital may only be spent if the council wishes to use it to purchase property or land for the benefit of the parish.

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Clifford Local History Group

A walk around the Parish Boundary 18 July 2021

Sun hats and sun cream were the order of the day as 18 villagers braved the heat on Sunday 18 July to walk the Parish Boundary. Common sense prevailed and we decided to leave the walk on the other side of the A1, where there is very little shade, until a later date. We followed the boundary as closely as possible and members of the History Group pointed out historical features along the way.

Initially we were relatively sheltered from the sun as we left St Edwards, down Old Mill Lane and Windmill Rd to the permissive path to Bramham School. Continuing up Gypsy Lane to the cycle track and the footbridge over the A1 where we returned to the track to Winnow Lane and down Primrose Lane. Getting quite hot by this time and 4 of the group called it a day!

We had to deviate from the boundary again but arrived at Martin House and the Shire Estate, which, of course, are in Clifford! We walked along Green Lane, over the beck which is the boundary between Clifford and Bramham and along footpaths back to the Mill pond and to St Edwards.

We welcomed some new faces on the walk and we hope they enjoyed the introduction to the village.

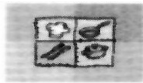
This will be restarting on Tuesday 7th September in the Methodist Church Schoolroom from 10am to 11.30am. All welcome.

OUT AND ABOUT AROUND CLIFFORD

Another step forward for our Village Hall

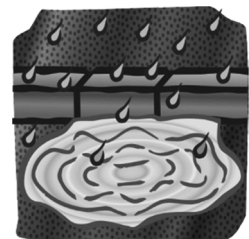
Saturday 24th July saw the re-opening of the newly altered Village Hall. We have to be grateful to all those who have put so much work into planning, fund-raising and organising to make this possible. As was said at the event, the village hall is a central feature of our community and a focus for much activity. We were reminded by the displays mounted by various groups in the village of all that is available to residents. It was also great to see so many villagers coming along to take part in the occasion.

The new extension with its provision of a larger kitchen and new toilets brings the village hall to an even higher standard. Since its original build in the early 1960s, it has been modified and extended several times. Importantly, the provision of the pitched roof in 2006 to deal with the constant problem of a leaking flat roof helped to secure the building's future. This year's improvement followed on from that. The hall has become what it is thanks to the work of all the Trustees over the years who have passed the baton on to successors. The community will always need people in the village to take on that baton for future residents of the village.

Let's hope all the various activities will be joined by others to continue making the hall a vibrant centre of community life. There's lots going on so join in. If you want to start something up you don't have to look far for a venue!

The Great Puddle

With the end of the rainy period this gradually drained away. Significantly, it revealed a grid totally blocked with soil. Perhaps if this could be cleared out we might not see the puddle again.





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GREEN CLIFFORD

The Big Butterfly Count run by the charity Butterfly Conservation is now closed. At first glance the Clifford recordings show reduced numbers and reduced diversity. So no commas with the orange wavy-edged wings, no painted ladies flying in from overseas, no speckled woods which like dappled sun light and no sombre coloured ringlets. However the Clifford recordings show we had a few small tortoiseshells, holly blues, large and small whites, peacocks, gatekeepers and a single red admiral. The gatekeepers were abundant in our garden in late July/early August especially enjoying the nectar in the marjoram flowers. If you are interested in the results of this excellent citizen science project, take a look at the results map at <https://bigbutterflycount.butterfly-conservation.org/about>. I was pleased to spot a small copper butterfly on the limestone grassland at Hetchell Woods (which is our nearest Yorkshire Wildlife Trust reserve and a most delightful place at any time of year) in early August on a sunny evening.

If we stop using pesticides and encourage plants that insects love, we'll tend to see butterfly, moth and other insect numbers increasing in Clifford. And the birds and small mammals follow the insects so that is an extra bonus. I am still enjoying the swifts, swallows, wagtails and house martins in the horses' fields near Rhodes Lane and think I saw a sparrowhawk this morning. Two beautiful twin donkeys, with an unusual lateral strip down their haunches, are now resident near the Rhodes lane football field. Our dog is intrigued and delighted. He seems to view them as an interesting breed of large dog!

September will bring lots of lovely juicy blackberries to the hedgerows. We have three apple trees and struggle to eat or store all the produce. Here is a recipe for blackberry and apple jelly. Yeadons sell jelly bags (for straining the fruit) and you can use your old glass jars as long as you sterilise them in a very hot oven for 15 minutes and pour boiling water over the lids. Local food and not an e number in sight! Do ring me if anyone wants apples : 07749701655.

1.75 kg blackberries
1.75 kg apples
1 large lemon
900ml water
1.75-2.75kg granulated sugar

Peel, core and chop the apples. Put the apples and blackberries in a large saucepan with the water and bring to a simmer. Cover with a lid and simmer gently for about an hour. Pour all the fruit and juice carefully into your jelly bag which needs to be suspended over a large bowl to catch all the juice. (I upturn a tall wooden stool and tie the bag to the legs and place the bowl underneath. It takes some planning. You might be able to use knobs or handles on a kitchen cupboard). Leave the bag straining for at least 2 hours or overnight. Measure the juice in the bowl and allow 450g of sugar for each 600ml of juice. Bring the juice to the boil and stir in the sugar until dissolved. Add the lemon juice. Boil gently for about 15 minutes until setting point is reached. (This is the tricky bit. Put a little on a cold saucer from the fridge and see if a skin wrinkles when you push with a little finger.) It's delicious on a scone! Perhaps a rainy day activity.

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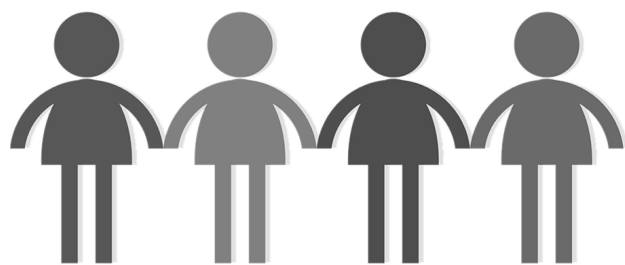


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CLIFFORD LADIES
