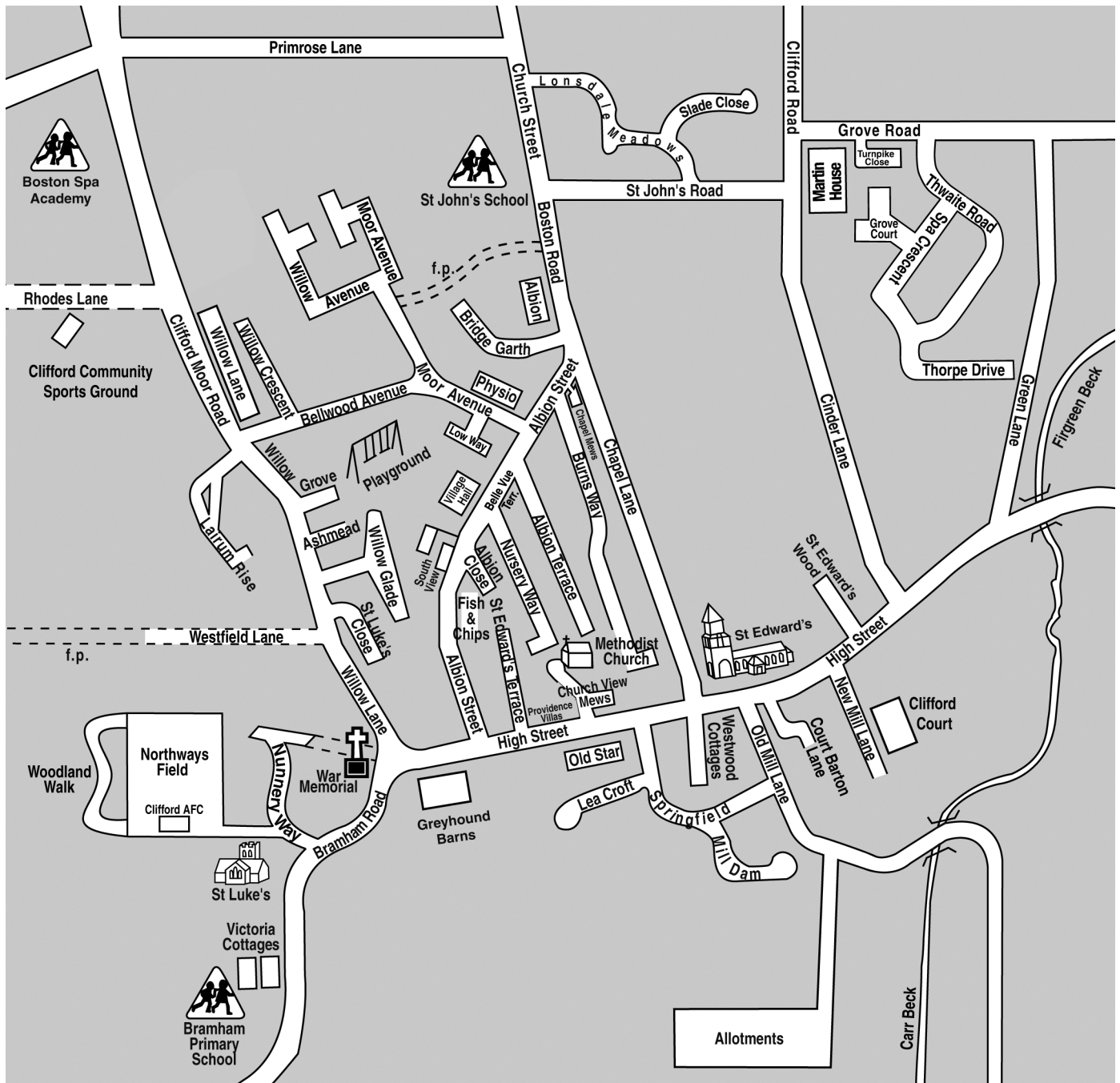

A centenary for the village: *Happy Birthday AC*

That's AC electricity. Early in the development of electricity it was decided that AC (Alternating Current) power was the preferred option rather than DC. When electricity became available for the domestic market, parish councils had to provide their own generating plants. The first to do so around here was Tadcaster Parish Council. They built their plant on Station Road, next to the railway line, to allow easy access to coal. In the early 1920's Clifford parish council approached Tadcaster asking if an extension of their existing system could be brought to Clifford. In response, the first supply of electricity was delivered to the village in around 1924. The extension of the supply was then later installed to Boston Spa.

The supply to the properties was the supplier's responsibility, the installation of electricity into the properties was the owners' responsibility. In most cases, the main supply was installed (especially terraced houses) at one end, installed externally above door/window height and spliced into each property. This can still be seen on various properties in the village, for example Belle Vue Terrace, St Edward's Terrace, and Victoria Terrace (now Victoria Place).

In the late 1920s it was decided that larger power generators/power stations were required. This led to the construction of, for example, Ferrybridge coal fired power station. This was due to the construction of new domestic/commercial buildings. The advancement in technology was also a factor. As these larger generators came online then the small parish generators were closed. It became more readily available for constructions/builders to install a supply as part of the construction process. The first new properties in Clifford constructed like this were in 1927 - the row of semi-detached houses running from St. Edward's church towards the Albion pub. It was given the address of Ashfield Avenue. It was later altered bringing in both sides of the street, becoming Chapel Lane as at present. A little later Willow Grove also enjoyed power being built in.

Several senior residents will recall that some properties right up to the late 1960s, never had electricity installed before they were demolished.

The Parish Council meets on the 3rd Wednesday of the month at 7.30 pm at Clifford Village Hall. The meeting dates for 2024 are: January 17th, February 21st, March 20th, April 17th, May 15th, June 19th, July 17th, August – no meeting, September 18th, October 16th, November 20th and December 18th.

Neighbourhood Plan Review

At the October meeting the Council will be considering setting up a Neighbourhood Plan Review Working Group. Clifford's Neighbourhood plan was adopted in 2017. Neighbourhood Plans can be reviewed after five years and updated to ensure that they remain relevant and effective. The current plan can be found at:

Residents will be consulted about any proposed amendments to the plan.

Pavement Parking

A resident has raised concerns about inconsiderate parking on Nunnery Way during football matches. Clifford FC have been advised not to have back-to-back matches to ease congestion, and to ensure that they marshal parking during matches. It was agreed that car parking spaces will be marked out at the Northways car park to ensure efficient use of the space. The Council appreciates that there is limited on street parking in Clifford which can lead to congestion. However, please do not park on pavements at this can be hazardous for pedestrians especially those using mobility aids or with pushchairs.

There are several overgrown trees close to the beacon. Quotes are being obtained to cut them back. The bench at Northways has been removed as it was damaged beyond repair. It was agreed that any replacement bench should be sited in a more suitable location at Northways. This will be considered at the October meeting.

Dog fouling

The Council continues to receive complaints about dog fouling on the pavements and public spaces in Clifford. Most recently, there have been complaints about dog fouling on the grass by the children's playground at the rear of the Village Hall. Dog fouling is a messy eyesore. More importantly, it creates potential hazards for health (especially for children). All dog owners have a legal duty to clean up after their animal immediately after it fouls in a public area and to dispose of the waste in an appropriate bin. 'Not noticing' is not an excuse. The Council will shortly be installing several dog bag dispensers throughout Clifford so all dog walkers will have easy access to dog waste bags as needed.

Annual Audit 2023/2024

Gardeners Corner - November 2024

Although the cold and wet is likely to have set in there are plenty of flowers such as asters, coloured leaves, crab apples, berries and hips around to add a splash of colour about the place!

To quote the RHS (Royal Horticultural Society), 'many people consider this the end of the gardening season, but it is really the beginning'. Work carried out now takes pressure off the busy time to come in spring.

- Mulch vegetable beds/ flower borders and under special roses and shrubs. Use your own or commercial compost/ soil improver.
- Tidy up/ clear away old stems and dead foliage, but leave ornamental seedheads, grasses and things like sedum. The birds or small mammals will appreciate the seeds, and it can look beautiful in the dew or frost
- Put your leaf and plant debris on the compost heap- remember to chop up or shred larger stems into small pieces. The rule of thumb is **3 parts brown materials** such as shredded woody materials, brown leaves, newspaper and cardboard **to 1 part green**, soft leafy material, peelings, fallen fruit etc
- Although many plants have stopped flowering now- look out for winter flowering shrubs. There are plenty to choose from and some are also scented. An example is *Viburnum x bodnantense*
- Prune the 3 D's from trees and shrubs- Dead, Diseased and Damaged twigs and branches
- hold on until early spring to prune ornamental elders (Sambucus), Cotinus, dogwood (Cronus)etc for ornamental leaves and stems next year
- Lift dahlias, remove the soil and put in an open topped box somewhere cool and dark
- See October as many jobs are similar

Planning ahead

Order seed catalogues- you can start to choose what you'd like to grow next year while the memory is fresh in your mind of things you have seen working well

Renovate hedges and prune vines in the greenhouse

Mindful moment

For many of us this is a busy time of year outside of the garden so use your space, other public gardens or anywhere outdoors to focus on taking a relaxing moment. Even 60 seconds can be beneficial.

Breathe in the fresh air, appreciate the plants and wildlife, listen to the many sounds and leave the jobs for another day!!
