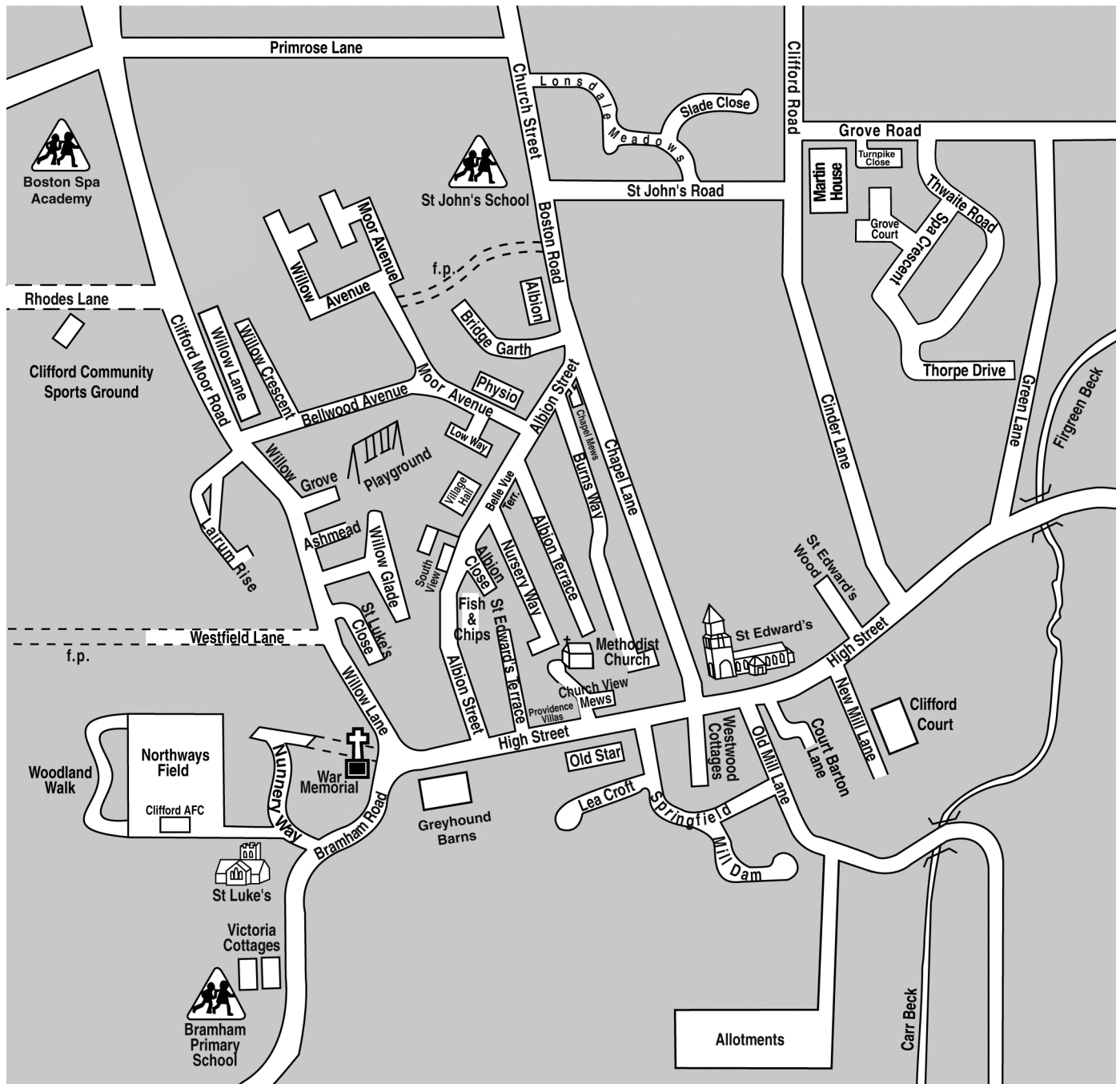

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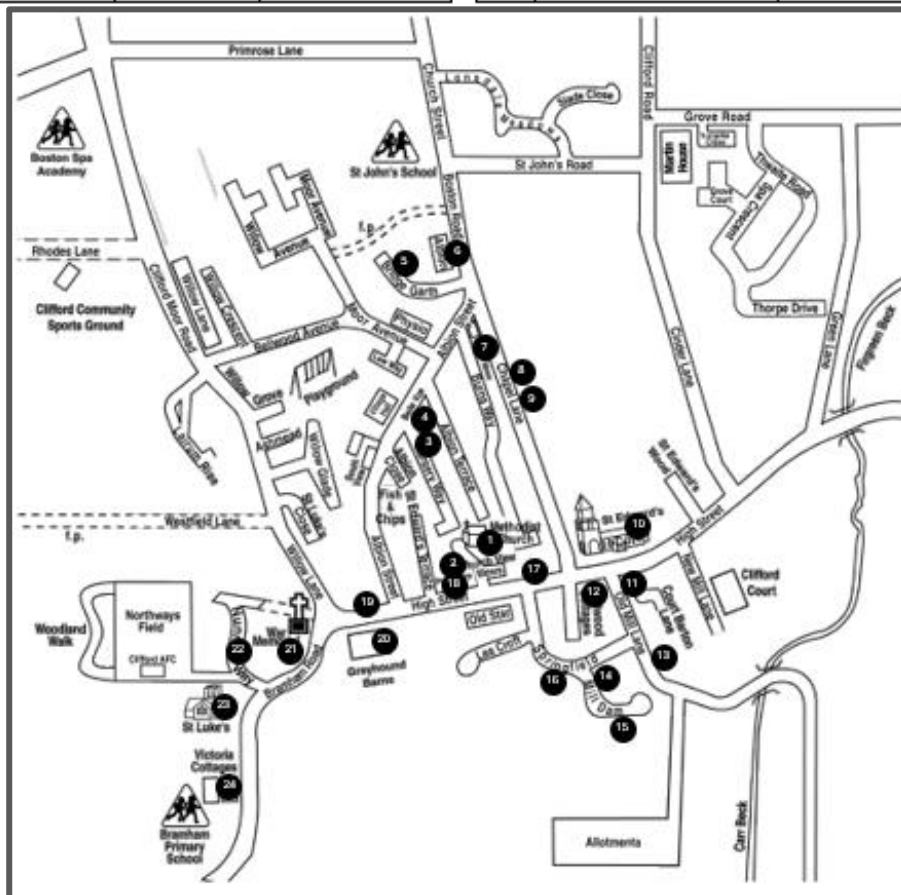

From the October Parish Council meeting

The Parish Council meets on the 3rd Wednesday of the month at 7.30 pm at Clifford Village Hall. The meeting dates for 2024 are: January 17th, February 21st, March 20th, April 17th, May 15th, June 19th, July 17th, August – no meeting, September 18th, October 16th, November 20th and December 18th.

Fibre broadband The council received a presentation from Quickline Communications who are undertaking a project to install a fibre broad band network in Boston Spa, Clifford and Bramham. 704 properties in Clifford will be connected and the work is scheduled to be completed by May 2025. Where possible existing ducting will be used to install the cables, but some additional poles and cabinets will need to be installed on verges.

Neighbourhood Plan The council has agreed to set up a Working Group to review the Clifford Neighbourhood Plan. The plan was adopted in 2017 and there is now the opportunity to review the plan, and amend it if necessary, to address any changes and challenges that Clifford faces. Bramham Primary School The council has agreed to contribute up to £10,000 towards the cost of installing an additional entrance at the rear of Bramham Primary School. This will improve the safety of children and their carers who walk to the school from Clifford. Bramham Parish Council have also committed to contribute £10,000 to the project.

Dog fouling There has been an increase in dog fouling at the Clifford Community Sports Ground (CCSG). This presents a health risk to the children who play football there. Notices will be installed at the CCSG reminding dog walkers that it is their responsibility to clear up after their dogs. If the problem persists the council will consider banning public access to CCSG.

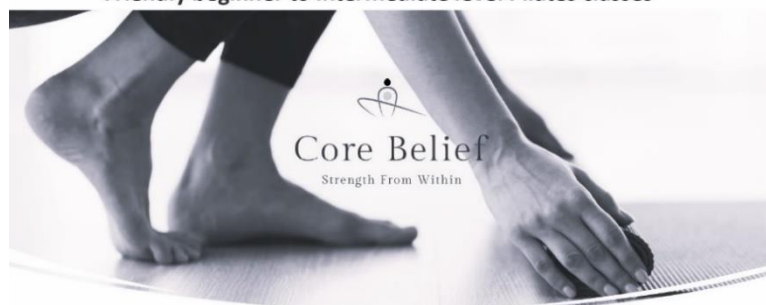

Clifford Local History Group Open Day 9th November 2024

Many thanks to everyone who visited our Open Day in November. It was a repeat of our very successful first Open Day last year, when 101 visitors attended. We never expected to get anywhere near that figure with a repeat performance, so imagine our delight when, at 5pm when we closed the shop, we had counted 97 people through the door!

All were very complimentary about the exhibits we had on show and the information passed on via our archive and the continuous slide show.

The presentation was running all afternoon, and great interest was expressed in seeing photos of the shops which used to supply the village. The pictures of the Mill Pond in its heyday, together with contrasts between the layout of the village over the last 100 or so years were greatly appreciated.

We had two display screens linked up to our digital archive, and visitors were able to interrogate facts, photos, and the 1921 census details, with help from the group members.

The Group were delighted to welcome many newcomers to our presentation, including Rev Abi Alex, the new minister of Clifford Methodist Church, and the new Head Teacher of St John's School Kevin Harrington.

Out and About in Clifford

Celebrations

As October ended the decorations for Hallowe'en began to appear. There were the customary skeletons, giant spiders, pumpkins, ghosts etc. with ample amounts of white webbing to accompany. The impression this year was that the displays were as inventive as usual but fewer seemed to have them. Do some folk think the use of plastic fibre webbing is inappropriate when we are trying to tackle microplastic etc? It was intriguing to see 'Happy Hallowe'en'. On the basis of what it is supposed to be about, does that really fit?

Lots of Scaffolding

During our supposedly summer months there seemed to be a stream of scaffolding going up around the village which is inevitable among a collection of some very mature buildings. Pointing seemed to have been very much in hand with a number of skilled workmen using lime mortar. We should be grateful to the owners of these properties who are seeking to keep our heritage in good shape & preserving the character of our surroundings.

On the other hand, some scaffolding was for installing solar panels.

One of the scaffolded locations receiving major attention was on Bramham Road opposite the baptismal well which seems to be renovation of the remaining section of the bell tower for the former Roman Catholic primary school - a welcome preservation of an important item of village history. Unfortunately, the section which held the bell came down some years ago & it seems only an old photograph remains.



The village stopped for Ray

On 5th November, traffic on Willow Lane was stopped for a short while as a funeral cortège passed by saying farewell to a well-known and long-lived member of the community. For many years Ray Norman, who worked with many skills in his jobs, used his personal time to keep a smallholding in Westfield Lane. His family decided that he should make his final journey from home in a wicker coffin on an agricultural cart pulled by a veteran tractor. It honoured him and his love of the land as he left the village. It was a tender scene reminding us of all those folk who once ploughed and worked the fields around Clifford long ago.

Remembrance Day

As is customary, residents of the village gathered at our War Memorial on Remembrance Sunday to honour those who lost their lives in the two world wars. Of all the community only two descendants have names of predecessors carved on the list. It was a large gathering which is difficult to accommodate at the busy road junction. It was welcome to see one cyclist having the courtesy to wait for an appropriate pause before passing through. It's a pity that some vehicles don't do the same. Two newly-appointed ministers for the area were present and took part: Abi Alex for the Methodists and Hannah Moore for the Anglicans.

Christmas is coming, which means..... **THE MUMMERS ARE COMING!!!**

As in previous years, **The Holbeck Moor Mummers** will be performing their mummers play at the Christmas folk gathering at **The Albion, Clifford** on **Wednesday 18th December**. There is no charge - but the hat will go round, with proceeds to **St Gemma's Hospice**. The session gets going a bit after 8pm.

Mummers plays are a (mainly English) tradition going back hundreds of years. Round these parts they're known as *Mummers*, in Cheshire they're *Soul Cakers*, in East Anglia it's *Plough Monday* - and Halloween may be a close relative. Many of these traditions are rooted in workers trying to raise a bit of money (and have a good time) when there wasn't much work - or pay - in the Winter months. This even extended into the West Midlands where the canal boatmen would go out as *Molly Dancers* to raise a bit of money when the canals were frozen over. (Molly Dancers could also be found in Lincolnshire and elsewhere.)

Like many other villages, Clifford had its own mumming side but, as with many others, the Clifford mummers play declined in the latter years of the 20th century. I understand that a DVD of the Clifford Mummers performances between 1994 to 1997 is in existence.

The Holbeck Moor Mummers were formed in Leeds in 1962 in an effort to revive a long-time Yorkshire Christmas custom. It must have succeeded since they're still performing every Christmas.

Don't forget the fairly folkie music gatherings at The Albion on the third Wednesday of every month.
