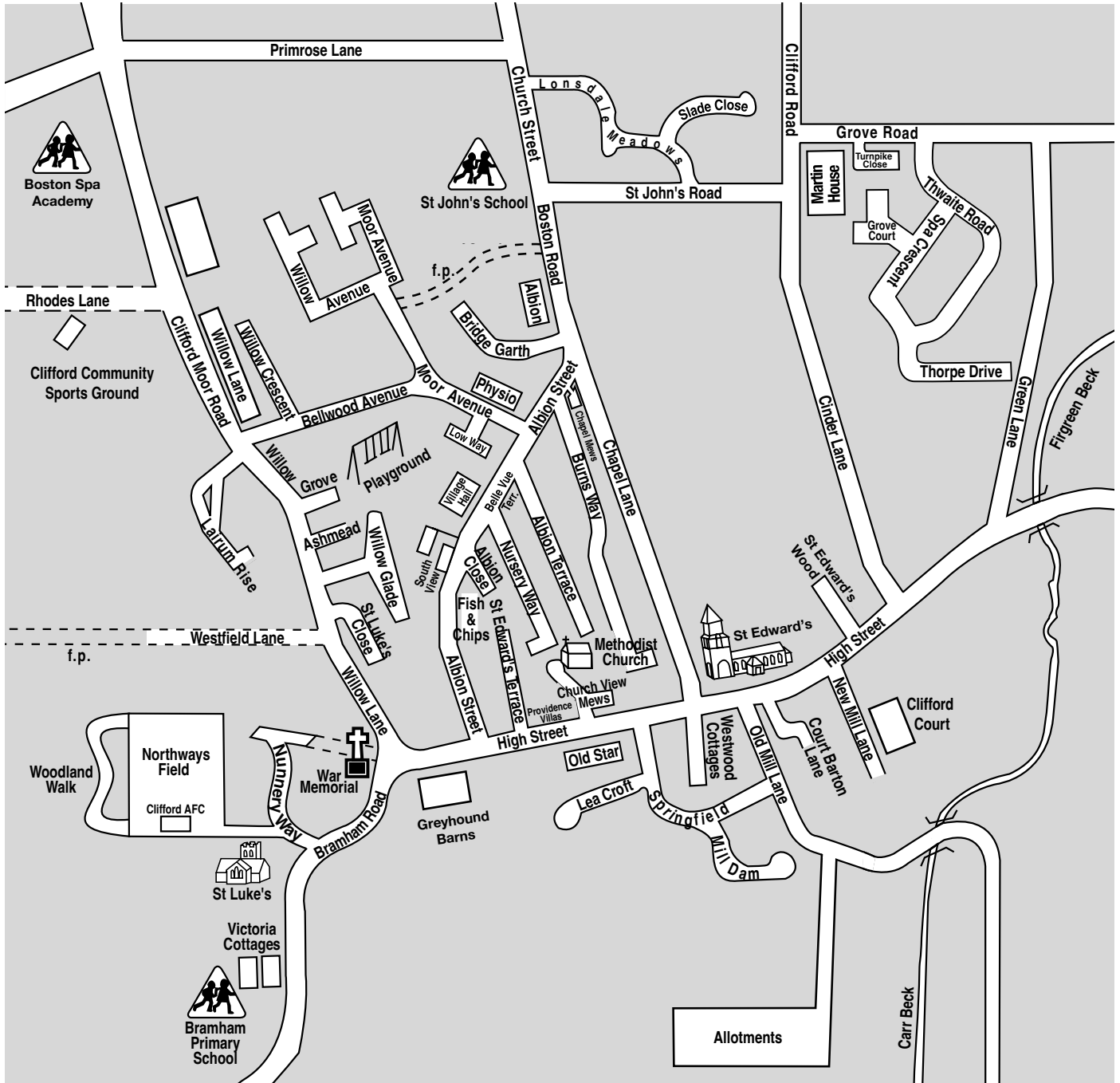

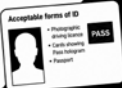

DEFIBRILLATORS

The Council has approved a grant to replace the defibrillator cabinet at the Albion Pub. The council funds several defibrillators in Clifford to help protect residents and visitors alike.

A cardiac arrest can happen to anyone, at any age, and often without warning. When this happens, every minute counts. Immediate CPR combined with the use of a defibrillator can more than double a person's chance of survival while waiting for the ambulance service to arrive. Defibrillators are designed to be used by everyone. They are safe, simple, and provide clear spoken instructions throughout the process. The device will automatically assess the casualty and will only deliver a shock if one is needed. You cannot accidentally harm someone by using it.



In an emergency, always dial 999 first. The ambulance operator will guide you through CPR and, if appropriate, direct you to the nearest defibrillator and provide the access code if the cabinet is locked.



Knowing where your nearest defibrillator is located could one day help save a life. As well as the **Albion Pub**, there are defibrillators at the **Village Hall**, **Northways Playing Field** and the **Clifford Community Sports Ground**.



PLAYGROUND DEVELOPMENT

The Council had approved a grant of £60,000 towards the redevelopment of the playground at the Village Hall. The Village Hall have committed £10,000 towards the project and further grants will be applied for. Quotes have been obtained from three contracts. Following consultation with residents, it is intended that the new playground will have a zip wire, accessible items of play equipment and separate areas for toddlers and older children. There will also be seating for parents and carers.



CLIFFORD COMMUNITY SPORTS GROUND

Playground Update

The Trustees are very pleased to announce that they have chosen a design and a supplier to replace the children's playground at the end of the gardens. The playground is approaching the end of its usable lifespan after 25 years of good use.

A comprehensive consultation by the Trustees to canvass the needs of all children using the playground included a village questionnaire, focus meetings and open days to showcase various designs. Assistance and input into the design have also been provided from our Clifford Parish Councillors, Wetherby Ward Councillors and also from Leeds City Council Officers on access, diversity and current legislation.

Designs and quotations to meet the resulting design brief were provided by a number of suppliers.

The design chosen is from a company called ESP Play Ltd. The plan will be on display at the Clifford Beer Festival on Saturday 27th June.

The cost of the project is approximately £160,000.

The Parish Council has generously promised a donation of up to £60,000 and with the £10,000 the Village Hall has raised so far, we have a great start towards the total required.

Our fundraising is greatly helped by the work of a village resident who has huge experience in obtaining grants for such projects and we are also liaising with Wetherby Ward Councillors to access any government funds available.

The Trustees of Clifford Village Hall are deeply concerned by an episode of antisocial behaviour which occurred a few weeks ago in the Children's Playground.

Disgusting graffiti was scrawled on pieces of equipment, and the waste bin was upturned with rubbish left around the area. A sign was also uprooted.

A Trustee erased the graffiti the next day and the Chairman of the Parish Council righted the bin and cleared the rubbish.

The incidents have been reported to West Yorkshire Police, who have agreed to increase PCSO activity in the park area.

We have CCTV coverage throughout the hall area, and this extends to the area of the playground.

It is disappointing that we have to involve the police, and we hope that, with this warning, we will see no further behaviour of this nature.

There are opportunities to return to the village at several points along the route if 6 miles is too far.

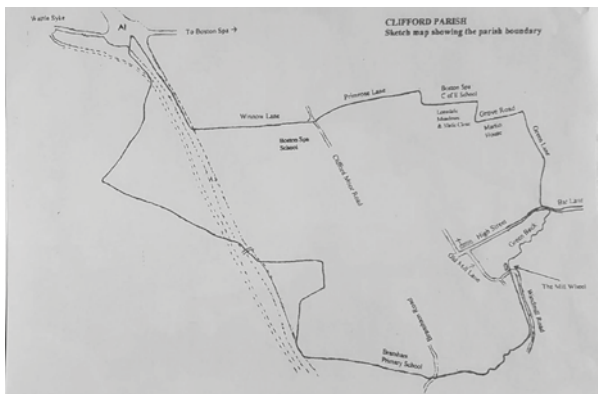
Wear sensible footwear and bring a waterproof just in case.

Kepwick and the Cleveland Way
16 April 2026

Six walkers met at a gated car park at Kepwick just north of Maltby. The walk started with a steady climb up onto the high moors to join the Cleveland Way which is also the course of the Hambleton Drove Road an ancient way of getting cattle and sheep to the concentrations of population in the growing cities at the start of the industrial revolution. Once on the moors the walking was level with a broad path. Horses, mountain bikers and walkers all sharing the route. We even came across four men playing an impromptu game of cricket!

We stopped to eat our sandwiches choosing a bowl in the landscape to shelter us from the fresh breeze, enjoying watching the birds flying in the gusty wind and listening to their calls. We dropped down into the valley stopping at a lime kiln. Further along we could see the route of a tramway which was used to carry limestone from the quarry down to the valley. The top part of this was a gravity powered a 1 in 5 incline where a rake of loaded tubs pulled a rake of empty tubs back up as it descended. A horse drawn tramway continued for three and a half miles to get the limestone to the kilns at Leake.

We regrouped at the Carpenters arms at Felixkirk for a refreshing drink. We enjoyed dry weather with many sunny intervals. Thanks to Alan and Liz for an interesting and scenic walk.

Boston Spa College

In the 19c it was still normal for only boys to be educated at school, unless girls came from an affluent family. In those days if boys wanted to further their prospects, they had to be privately educated.

Boston Spa College for Boys was such a school, it was opened in 1867, a Rev Dr Brewer assumed the lease in a large property in the village, which had recently been constructed for the purposes of being a school. He was born in Norfolk in 1813. He was teaching in London until 1863 when he became Principal at Hyde Park school, Leeds. An article in the Leeds Mercury (ref BNA) 1867 records that he was the Principal at Stourton (Stutton) Grove academy, Nr Tadcaster. Whilst there he wanted to increase the number of boarders, the building was unsuitable, the school closed shortly afterwards.

When Rev Dr Brewer, opened Boston Spa College, the property had twelve bedrooms, and an extension was being constructed. Instead of stables and outbuilding a dining room and a further twenty bedrooms above, where constructed instead.

The prospectus included the following, Music, Ancient & Modern languages, English, Drawing and Drilling, etc. Adverts to attend the school were placed in local papers and included their cost per term, "Charges per term under 12 years of age 30 Guineas per annum, above 12 years of age 35 Guineas. A junior department for youths under 9 years of age 25 Guineas per annum".

An article in the Leeds Mercury (ref BNA) for early 1871 printed that Dr Brewer's library was up for sale containing 3000 volumes. When the 1871 census was taken there was 38 Scholars boarding, various servants and two assistant teachers.

In 1872, Dr Brewer retired from the college and teaching and returned to London, he died in March 1875, he is buried at Abney Park Cemetery, London.

Following his departure from the college the next Principal was a Dr Payton M.A PhD., again articles were inserted in newspapers to advertise costs and when the next term was due to begin.

In the Leeds Mercury (ref BNA) in 1875 it reported that Dr Payton of Boston Spa College was moving to Devonshire Hall, High Harrogate, and that the former college will be closing.

In the Boston Spa News (ref BNA) May 1875, an article appears as follows:

“ The premises known as Dr Brewers College, together with certain other new residences nearby and three fields contiguous, and situate between Clifford & Boston Spa, the property of Mr Greenwood, have been bought by Mr Augustine Grimstone, the son and junior member of the firm of Messrs Grimstone and Co, of Clifford Flax and Thread Mills, for the Roman Catholic Bishop of Beverley, and, as we learn, the former for a deaf and dumb college.”

Clifford Local History Group

One of the aims of the History Group is to study and involve the village community in achieving a wide understanding of the historical development of the village from the earliest times, so it was lovely to receive a request from one of our Brownies in the village asking for help in achieving her Local History Badge. She had been reading the articles in Outlook and so thought she would ask if she could meet someone from the group to help her with some questions that she had.

The request was to interview someone who had lived in the village for a long time. This was her letter: -



Dear Clifford History Group,

My name is Jessica and I go to Clifford Brownies. I am doing my Local History Badge, as part of this I have been using all of your info. on Clifford. It has been very interesting and useful.

For my badge I have one task left to do. I would like to interview someone who has lived in Clifford for a very long time and I wondered if you knew someone who would be willing to be interviewed.

Thank you very much,

Yours sincerely,
Jessica.

I was asked to meet with her. She came with her mum, and we had a lovely long chat about all sorts, but Jessica's initial list of questions were:

- *How long have you lived in Clifford?*
- *What was Clifford like when you moved here?*
- *How has Clifford changed?*
- *Were there more or less children then?*
- *Which was bigger, Clifford or Bramham?*
- *What shops were there?*
- *Where were the schools? Was Boston high school still there?*
- *What were the main village events every year?*
- *What's the biggest event you can remember?*

They were great questions, though we didn't manage to get through them all. We did discuss how long I had lived here, and before that in Boston Spa, and how different Clifford was then. The fact that I could do all my shopping in Clifford, we had two grocers, a butchers, post office/newsagent which also sold lots of household goods, and a hairdressers. There was also a Garage that sold petrol. This would have been 1971/2. Before then, there were a number of other businesses in the village.

Jessica and her mum did not realise that there was a Primary School here in the middle of the village, where St Edwards Wood and the adjoining houses now are. My children had a wonderful time there. It was terribly sad when LCC closed it. We also had a playgroup in the old school by the Methodist Church.

We maybe didn't get through all the questions as we kept going off at tangents, telling stories about a bit of history e.g. the different wells in the village, but lunch was calling for Jessica and her mum, and I certainly enjoyed having a reminisce!!

The Brownie pack in Clifford is also a significant part of the history of the village, having started in 1953.

I'm pleased to say that we had a lovely letter and photo from Jessica to say that she had achieved her Local History Badge. Well done, Jessica!!
